They also invited James to a meeting to discuss progress with leisure resources and other events.



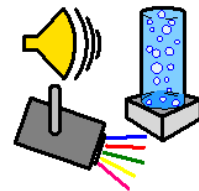

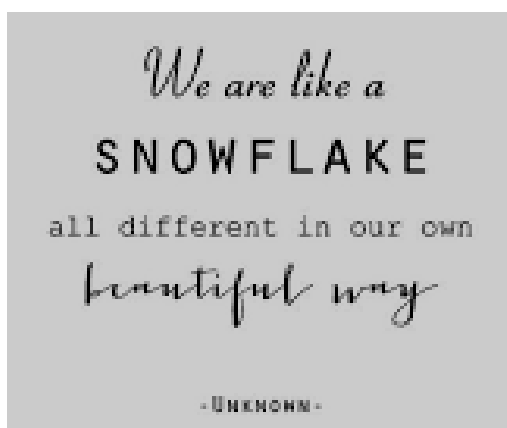
